A.1. General Presentation—Reinventing the ORU: Research as Teaching and Public Service

The Institute of Governmental Studies is the University of California's primary center for interdisciplinary study and research in politics, government, and public policy. IGS works with undergraduates, graduate students, and scholars across the campus and around the world to further the University's primary goals of teaching, research, and public service. While most ORUs have a narrow research focus, IGS has long pursued a broader mandate. We believe that research benefits from the synergy generated by teaching and public service, and our experience confirms that belief. This synergy is not a recent discovery. At its birth in 1919 as the Bureau of Public Administration, IGS committed itself to use its resources—its library, its research capacity, its publications program, and its teaching and training—to help solve “the important problems of government administration.”

Among its many activities, IGS:

- Encourages undergraduate research by providing faculty guidance and administrative and financial support.
- Provides faculty expertise to state legislators and commissioners and sponsors conferences on campus and in Sacramento to examine key policy questions from political regulatory reform to constitutional revision and digital democracy.
- Works closely with the electronic and print press to see that the public is better informed about electoral decisions and governmental actions.
- Offers university-wide leadership in assembling colleagues to study issues such as recall elections and term limits, and to explore new research initiatives.
- Publishes books that help to define state politics from the governor's race to the changing impact of racial and ethnic politics in California.
- Gives financial and intellectual support to journalists who write major biographies of state political leaders including Phil Burton, Willie Brown, Jesse Unruh, Pat Brown, and Earl Warren.
- Provides a campus forum for leading figures from the world of politics and public affairs.

Every program IGS presents is open to the public. Every research project incorporates a role for students. We are constantly inventing new ways to disseminate the results of state supported research to those people who can best put it to use. A brief outline of these efforts follows.

Teaching, Training & Research

Graduate Students

ORUs are not teaching units per se. But invaluable instruction can take place in a research environment that teaches students the art of discovery. IGS provides financial support, faculty guidance, and a campus home to 45 doctoral candidates. These students work with IGS scholars as Graduate Student Researchers or serve as Teaching Assistants in classes taught by IGS faculty and associates. At IGS, teaching, training, and research are all part of an open-ended, ongoing process that occurs in informal discussions in faculty offices or impromptu talks over tea as well as in formal seminars, at conferences, and in structured research projects. Some recent examples:

- Ongoing seminars and colloquia offer selected graduate students the opportunity to work closely with faculty members in organizing meetings that bring distinguished authors and scholars to campus. IGS now hosts five such series, focusing on American political history, American politics, positive political theory, the relationship of business and government, and race, ethnicity, and immigration.
- IGS welcomes state legislators and other political practitioners to campus on a regular basis, allowing graduate students and others to interact with some of the leading political figures in the state. In the past year, for example, Assemblyman Mark Leno spoke about the struggle to enact his bill that would legalize gay marriage, and Rob Stutzman, director of communications for Gov. Arnold Schwarzenegger, discussed the governor's agenda.
- Political Science Ph.D. candidate Matt Grossmann teamed up with Christine Trost, who completed her doctorate in political science at Berkeley in 2000, to edit *Win the Right Way: How to Run Effective Local Campaigns in California*, a primer for first-time candidates. The book is based on research by the IGS Center on Campaign Leadership, which brought together practitioners, scholars, and students

to study the best practices of political campaigns. It was published by the IGS Berkeley Public Policy Press.

- Teaming up with campus and governmental cosponsors, IGS held a town meeting on transatlantic trade and economic relations. The discussion addressed a variety of topics, including how to promote growth, spur innovation, and eliminate impediments to further economic integration.
- The IGS Center on Institutions and Governance, with nine cosponsoring partners, organized a major conference on democracy and global Islam. The goal of the conference was to promote a better understanding of Islam as a way of informing the public about major national and international issues.
- The ninth annual Travers Ethics Conference, sponsored by IGS in conjunction with the Institute of International Studies, brought together scholars and practitioners to discuss the laws and practices that govern wartime behavior.
- IGS and Worcester College (Oxford) combined to stage a three-day conference on the United States Senate. The event, organized by Nelson W. Polsby of the IGS faculty and Alan Ware of Worcester College, was held in the newly constructed Rothermere American Institute at Oxford. One topic of focus was the history and importance of Senate leadership positions.

Undergraduates

- The IGS Center on Politics provides support and assistance to undergraduate political groups, from partisan organizations such as the College Republicans and the Young Democrats to nonpartisan groups such as the *Berkeley Political Review*. IGS Senior Consultant Jerry Lubenow advises the staff of the *Review*.
- Students interested in practical political experience benefit from the Cal in Sacramento Platinum Fellowships program, which is administered by the IGS Center on Politics. This past summer, the program sent 15 Platinum Fellows to work in the legislature, the governor's office, state agencies, and media organizations. This fall, we appointed a distinguished team to coteach a political science course that will prepare next summer's batch of fellows—former state Sen. Patrick Johnston and longtime senior legislative staff member John Decker. Both Johnston and Decker have been visiting fellows at IGS and offer tremendous leadership to the Platinum Fellowship program.
- IGS employs more than 20 undergraduates in a variety of positions. Many perform administrative tasks, but some are hired to conduct research under the auspices of faculty members or graduate students.
- Former Assemblyman and IGS Legislator-in-Residence Ted Lempert was appointed to teach the popular political science course in California politics, which has long been supported by IGS. The best research by students in the class is excerpted in the IGS *Public Affairs Report*.
- Veteran political consultant Dan Schnur once again taught his popular course in political strategy, offering to motivated students the lessons of a long and distinguished career in the political trenches.

Public Service

IGS has a strong orientation to public service and views its mission to educate as extending beyond its students to the people of California and to their representatives in state and local government. The ability of IGS simultaneously to serve the Capitol, the campus, and the community has been significantly strengthened with the creation of programs such as the Center on Politics and Public Service and the Berkeley/Sacramento Program. Among the Institute's many service activities:

- The IGS Center on Politics held its 24th annual Review of the Presidency. The event, jointly sponsored with the UC Berkeley Extension, brought together a distinguished panel, including *Newsweek* writer Eleanor Clift and former Secretary of Labor Robert Reich, to discuss the status of the Bush administration.
- The Institute's *Public Affairs Report* is sent to thousands of readers across the country, chronicling IGS research, events, and writing. It is read and regularly praised by scholars, journalists, and public figures.
- Media representatives in the Bay Area, across California, and throughout the nation regularly call upon IGS experts to comment on issues of pressing public concern. A count of media citations over the past decade found IGS mentioned hundreds of times, far more than the next most cited Berkeley social science ORU.

- While many ORUs have closed their libraries, the IGS Library remains a unique resource on a vast range of public issues for scholars, students, public officials, and the general public. During election years, including this year's special election, the library's website election "Hot Topics" provide especially timely public education.
- As more and more ORUs have ceased their efforts at publishing, IGS Press and its Berkeley Public Policy Press imprint have become an important campus resource, publishing materials for other ORUs, schools, and departments.
- The Berkeley/Sacramento program brings legislators and public officials to campus to meet with students, faculty, and the public. The Berkeley Briefings component of this program brings faculty members and other experts to Sacramento to brief senior legislative and executive-branch staff.

A.2. Research Narrative - Director's Statement

This year was both challenging and successful for the Institute of Governmental Studies. Internally, the Director, Professor Bruce Cain, assumed the position of Director of the University of California Washington Center and had enhanced administrative responsibilities. This led to the appointment of Jack Citrin as Associate Director and a consultative pattern of administration that dealt with significant changes in staffing. During this academic year, the long-term Business Manager of IGS retired and her assistant took a new job and the Head Librarian also retired. With the support of the Vice Chancellor for Research, support for administration was increased and Ann Benker was hired to the new position of MSO. In addition, a new Head Librarian was hired from within and he also was replaced with a new hire. These changes have resulted in improved services in the area of fiscal management and library services.

A second major internal change was the reconstitution of the National Advisory Council. The Director recruited Darius Anderson of Platinum Advisors to act as chair and an active new set of members now is on board. They are spearheading a fund-raising program designed to institutionalize support for the Cal-in-Sacramento program administered by IGS and to provide support for conferences, visiting speakers, and research.

In 2005-06, IGS began the renovation of its library to take into account changes in information services in the digital era and to improve the ability to use the library as a multi-purpose unit that can serve as a location for conferences and seminars. A major commitment of funds to this project has resulted in an attractive new facility that already is widely used.

In 2005-06, IGS expanded its program of research colloquia by adding seminars on Business and Politics and American Political Change. The first seminar was led by Professor David Vogel of the Haas School of Business, the second by Professor Laura Stoker of Political Science. Both were well-attended and will be continued in the future. The papers presented by speakers at these colloquia became part of the IGS Working Paper Series.

In addition to colloquia, IGS sponsored several important workshops and conferences, often in collaboration with other units on campus. These conferences included: *Government by the People in California*, co-sponsored with UCDC and the James Irvine Foundation, *Women in Politics*, co-sponsored with the University of Virginia, with proceedings to be published in book form, *Reinventing Britain*, co-sponsored with the Center for British Studies with papers published by Methuen Press in 2007 as a book, and *France-Etats Unis*, a comparative analysis of ethnic and urban politics that too is resulting in a book-length publication. In addition, IGS contributed to a conference on the renewal of the Voting Rights Act sponsored by the Boalt School of Law. Under the direction of Professor Robert Powell, IGS sponsored the first year of an ongoing conference on the politics of weakly institutionalized states, again with a set of important working papers.

The Center on Politics and the Center on Institutions & Governance sponsored well received symposiums on topics such as the California Special Election, regulatory reform in the EU, and the politics of the penal state. The Center on Politics also hosted former Governor Gray Davis for a campus visit that featured several meetings with students and a lecture to a class.

In the domain of research, IGS-affiliated faculty received grants from Russell Sage, NSF, the JEHT Foundation, the James Irvine Foundation, and elsewhere. The Principal Investigators are a diverse group from several departments, including Economics, Sociology, and Political Science.

Finally, IGS continues to be a leader in applied research with implications for institutional reform. The Statewide Database program and the Election Administration Research Center have been active in obtaining new research grants and for publishing important reports regarding redistricting, voting technology, and poll worker training.

B.3. Publications Narrative

IGS Publications enjoyed an especially productive and busy year in all aspects of the program: books, online publishing, and our periodical newsletter describing IGS activities, the *Public Affairs Report*.

Public Affairs Report

The *Public Affairs Report* experienced perhaps the greatest change. IGS Publications Editor Maria Wolf completely redesigned the *PAR*, producing a far more readable and appealing format that incorporated the use of color for the first time. Reader response to the new design has been extremely positive, with praise for the more accessible appearance and use of color. At the same time, we increased the frequency of the *PAR*, from twice a year to its traditional schedule of three times a year. This increased frequency of production allowed us to report on IGS events and initiatives in a more timely fashion, which has made the *PAR* a more useful tool for communicating with the many constituencies served by the Institute.

Book Publishing

Our book publishing continued strongly, with five new titles, four published traditionally and one published exclusively online:

- *Governing California: Politics, Government, and Public Policy in the Golden State*, edited by Gerald C. Lubenow. This is an updated, second edition of one of our best-selling books, which is widely used in California politics courses. It includes chapters by leading scholars, journalists and political practitioners regarding the Legislature, the budget, term limits, the executive branch, the judiciary, local government, direct democracy, redistricting, debates, immigration and water policy.

- *California Legal History*, edited by Harry N. Scheiber. This is a collection of essays on legal issues and history published by IGS Press in cooperation with the California Supreme Court Historical Society. Topics covered include the history of housing discrimination in California, an oral history by the late California Supreme Court Justice Frank Newman, and the reprint of an important essay on the California Constitution by the late Justice Stanley Mosk.

- *Earl Warren and the Warren Court: The Legacy in American and Foreign Law*, edited by Harry N. Scheiber. This collection of essays was published jointly by IGS and Rowman & Littlefield, with whom we have an ongoing co-publishing arrangement, and with the Institute for Legal Research. An interesting aspect of this book is that it addresses the impact of the Warren Court not only in the United States, but also internationally.

- *A Future Worth Creating*, by Thomas P.M. Barnett. Published in cooperation with the Departments of Military Education, this book is based on the annual Chester W. Nimitz Memorial Lectures in National Security Affairs, in which Dr. Barnett explores issues of national and international security.

Online Publishing

Our online publishing program achieved a significant milestone when we published our first book exclusively online. *The California Political Almanac*, 2005-06 edition, edited by A.G. Block and Gerald C. Lubenow. The *Almanac*, published in conjunction with Congressional Quarterly Press, provides in-depth profiles of all California statewide elected officials, all members of the California Congressional Delegation and all members of the California Legislature, along with detailed information on the state's judiciary, bureaucracy, state budget, lobbyists, and even all California counties. The *Almanac* has a long history as a superb reference and research source regarding California politics, although the previous publishers, the *California Journal* and the *Sacramento Bee*, had allowed publication to lapse in recent years. IGS revived this important work.

At the same time, our series of IGS Working Papers, which are published online through the University's eScholarship Repository, continued to draw sharply increasing readership. IGS Working Papers were downloaded more than 20,000 times, more than twice as many as in any previous year. The success of the Working Papers series represents a substantial online outreach effort from IGS to its constituency groups in both the academy and the general public.
