

Grant T. Harris is a Senior Policy Advisor to Susan E. Rice, the U.S. Ambassador to the United Nations and a member of President Obama's Cabinet. Mr. Harris served as a member of the Obama/Biden Transition Team on the agency review team working on the U.S. Mission to the United Nations. Previously, Mr. Harris was an associate at the law firm of Cleary Gottlieb Steen & Hamilton LLP, where he focused on international financings and business transactions in Latin America. Prior to that, Mr. Harris served as Associate Director for African Affairs at the National Security Council at the White House and as a Special Assistant at the U.S. Mission to the United Nations.

Mr. Harris is a graduate of Yale Law School, where he served on the *Journal of International Law* and was awarded the Ambrose Gherini Prize for best paper in the field of international law. Mr. Harris also received a Master's in Public Affairs, with Distinction, from the Woodrow Wilson School of Public and International Affairs at Princeton University. He received a B.A. in Political Science, with Highest Honors, from the University of California, Berkeley, where he was president of the student body. His writings have appeared in such publications as *Yale Journal of Law & Policy*, *Berkeley Journal of International Law*, *Israel Law Review* (peer-reviewed), and *The San Francisco Chronicle*. He received the Francis Lieber Prize from the American Society of International Law for outstanding scholarship in the field of the law of armed conflict.
